## Musings from the Manse January 2026

Christianity is much in the news recently, and not for good reasons. People caught up in a worldview known as Christian Nationalism believe that God is for their country, their kind of people, for traditional legalism around ethical issues like abortion and sexuality, and for the “othering” of anyone different from them. It justifies making and protecting borders and throwing out, even violently, anyone who doesn’t fit the mould. For me and I guess for others, one of the most distressing things is that Christian symbols (like the cross and the Bible) are prominently displayed to promote values that directly contradict those of Jesus in the Gospels. Jesus took direct criticism for crossing physical and cultural boundaries to include women, Gentiles, handicapped people and even the hated Romans in his message of God’s love and forgiveness available through him – to all. It’s hard to fathom how Christian Nationalists can justify harnessing him to their cause, though logical deduction may not be their greatest strength.

Where we see God’s name being misused and God’s message being misrepresented, what can we do? We can pray for truth to be clearly heard and for God’s kingdom values of justice and peace to be practised worldwide. We pray that each week in our prayer groups and our Sunday morning intercessions. But locally, we can push back by graciously and clearly asserting the Jesus we know, and living His Gospel as well as we can. That’s called evangelism and mission. Thankfully we have many church initiatives that seek to do just that, including our café and food bank and youth ministry and many more. At the heart of it all is weekly worship on Sundays and Wednesdays, Bible reading and prayer. Next week we start our Bereavement Journey course to offer support and comfort to all who mourn, to show love for them in Jesus’ name. At the start of Lent we’ll be reading a Gospel together as a congregation – John this time – and meeting to talk about it. Every year I find this a necessary and ongoing corrective to my picture of Jesus, the real and surprising one we encounter in Scripture and not a self-created version who serves my own interests. We try, imperfect as we are, to seek God’s kingdom first and not our nation or any other.

So if you want to be part of growing the Kingdom of God in Auchterarder, please join us for worship or prayer or volunteer to be part of one of our ministries. We’d love to have you and we need all the help we can get. And in the face of the news, we hold fast to pray, “Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.” And believe that it will come, hopefully soon! *Maranatha* – even so come, Lord Jesus!

### **Bereavement Journey course**

The Bereavement Journey is an accredited course offered by churches to anyone who wants to explore their experience of bereavement and learn a bit about it. The thought is that we will go in the spring.

We will be discussing our next project in February. It will be a difficult choice as there are so many ideas for us to think about. This is a truly ecumenical group as we have ladies from all four churches in Auchterarder.

## APC Community Garden – January Update – Taking Stock

### Communal Area

As a reminder, our communal areas comprise five raised beds, a cut-flower strip, a fruit patch and our patio planters. We have completed five growing seasons since 2021 with 2026 our sixth. Fresh Fridays and our Veg' Share box at the library are well established with the community. We have a merry band of five volunteers who tend the garden and we are always happy to see new faces, even if you just want to come for a nosy and chat 😊



### Mini-allotments

We have ten mini-allotments that we offer to people from the community on a year by year basis. Utilization is high close to 100% but we also have a waiting list and usually there is just enough 'churn' so that folks don't have to wait long, normally only a few months. Last season we introduced a mini-allotment prize to encourage our growers and will continue that in 2026.

### Potager Garden

Last year's project, completed with the help of the PKC Biodiversity Fund and the Community Trust Fund, was three raised beds to grow perennial plants that are colourful, edible and good for wildlife, with a mini water feature included. The area will shortly be completed with a bench and a willow panel to encourage folks to sit and take stock. This area would lend itself to 'social prescribing' and we plan to speak with St Margarets Health Centre on how that might work. The largest of the three beds has been left with space for those who would benefit, to plant something and watch it mature over time with a place to sit, observe and reflect during their visits.

### Future Plans

Our vision for the Community Garden from way back in 2021 will be complete by the start of this year's growing season. We are now reflecting on how to make the best use of the garden for the benefit of the Church and Community. We would welcome any suggestions you might have, just email or speak with one of the garden volunteers. Why don't you visit our stall at the Community Fair in the Aytoun Hall on 28 Feb, 10-12, for a chat.



Leaving from the Bannockburn Visitor Centre the route headed West to circumnavigate






