#### **Musings from the Manse August 2025**

Summer gives time for more musings than usual, and I've been thinking about our church.

All churches have strengths and weaknesses, APC included. One strength is our children's and youth ministry, seen this summer in the Holiday Club. While we would have loved more children to attend, it was a brilliant success for those who came. A highlight was the family events – quiz night and ceilidh – both attended by a few families who are new to us. And it will be a special joy to welcome the Smith family to church tomorrow morning, for the baptisms of baby Robbie and mum Samantha, and to formally welcome Neil and Samantha to membership of our church. A real celebration for all of us – God is at work!

Another strength is prayer. Prayer is perhaps the most basic way that human beings connect with God, so it's something that anyone can explore no matter where they are in their faith journey. That's part of the Worship and Discipleship team's thinking behind offering the Prayer Course again (we did it 4 years ago during lockdown, if you remember!) It's also core to Christian discipleship, and all of us can be enriched by learning to pray in new and deeper ways. Along with the prayer course in October and November, our Sunday morning sermons will explore the Lord's Prayer, a bit at a time. Our weekly prayer groups are an invaluable part of our congregation's life, on Saturday mornings via Zoom at 9am and Sunday mornings in person before church at 9.30am. Anyone can join – please do!

Of course we pray for world situations as well as ourselves. A real weakness in APC has been our lack of an active commitment to issues of justice, mission and tackling world poverty. Recently we've begun to address that, with Muriel Pearson's visit to tell us about her work in Israel and provide insight into the Middle East conflict. Muriel is back tomorrow evening (Sunday 31<sup>st</sup>) at 7pm for a smaller sunday 31



and more informal opportunity to talk and pray. We embraced the opportunity to give to famine relief in Gaza via Christian Aid, raising almost £2K from the congregation. To keep the momentum going and make these concerns an ongoing focus of church life, we plan to resume our partnership with TEAR Fund. A TEAR Fund speaker is coming to tell us more on 2<sup>nd</sup> November. So hopefully we'll get better!

Another weakness (or area of need) is our lack of volunteers across the church. Currently we need someone to convene the Pastoral Care team, we have an urgent shortage of people to teach the children on Sunday mornings in Kidsteam, and we need help with finance – among other things. Can I urge you to reflect on where you might serve in APC, and get in touch with me or a Team convenor? We are strongest when everyone plays their part and we're not leaning heavily on too few people.

So, much to ponder, and pray God's strength for all that you read about in the newsletter!



Please join us if you are able.


#### **HOLDING THE SPACE**



#### Kirk Cafe update

We've got a lovely team of café volunteers but are aware that they work very hard, and we'd love to be able to make up a Rota so people can have weeks off! With that in mind, we're looking to recruit more volunteers to help out with the roles below. If you think you could help out, even if you could commit to a couple of hours once a month or be on stand-by if someone is on holiday, we'd love to have you as part of the team.

#### Café roles

**Front of house** – You will be welcoming people to the café, taking their order at the counter and delivering it to them. When people leave, you'll be clearing their table ready for the next guests and making sure the café space is clean and possibly help doing some dishes if we're quiet. Using the till is part of this role but we promise it's very easy and we'll show you how it's done!

**Barista** — An important part of the barista role is using the coffee machine (we'll show you how!) But you'll also welcome people to the café, take orders and deliver them to people at their tables. You'll help with clearing tables, using the till and generally keeping the café space clean and tidy.

**Kitchen** – We're delighted with the amount of people coming to the café, but it means there are always cups to be washed and this is where you would come in. The dishwasher is very quick and easy to use and being in the kitchen means you get to quality control the baking before it goes out to customers – just as important as washing dishes!

Communal Garden Despite the historically dry conditions, our beds continue to provide baskets of produce for the Community on Fresh Fridays and for our Veg' Share at the library. We have also found time to tidy up the patio garden, weeding the border and planting sunflowers which will make this area even



more appealing to sit in. The potager garden is really taking shape with beds now filled and planted. Next step is to lay bark between the beds, erect a willow screen and install a garden bench. We plan to make this corner of the garden a place to sit and relax, with one of the beds reserved for therapeutic gardening for those that would benefit from this type of activity. Mini-allotments The mini's continue to thrill with some giant sunflowers catching the eye. The demo' bed A has had a tidy up and carrots, radish and mini brossoli all sown

and mini broccoli all sown for a late autumn crop. The best bed competition continues with the final round of judging on 1 September. The winner will

be announced shortly after and presented with a £50 gardening voucher.

It's becoming clear that our vegetable growing enterprise could do with some more ground, more space means more veg' to share. There is no need to let anyone know you are coming. Just come along and you will be made most welcome..


#### **Advent in Austria**
